

CLIENT ALERT: Employee Free Choice Act Placed on Hold in the Senate

On July 22, 2009, MBJ posted a Client Alert addressing the possibility of an agreement being reached on compromise legislation related to the Employee Free Choice Act (“EFCA”). This compromise included a speedier election process replacing card check recognition. While some form of compromise legislation remains possible, it now appears that the Senate has placed the EFCA on hold while it considers health care reform and several other major bills. These large bills may take up the Senate’s attention for the remainder of the calendar year.
